

The student may use the same topic or change to a new topic. (ii) If a student has completed all the courses in the final semester but has not completed BDP II, he/she is required to extend his/her study for another semester in order to complete it. (iii) If a student who is suspended because his/her GPA < 1.0 and his/her CPA >= 2.0, he/she is allowed to continue his BDP II upon registration in the following semester. 							

		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Student is COMPULSORY to have meeting/consultation with supervisor in each semester AT LEAST SEVEN (7) TIMES BEFORE presenting in the seminar. If fail to do so, student can be barred from presenting in the seminar and automatically received E GRADE. 3. The e-log book must be submitted to the Supervisor and/or Co-supervisor (if any) for review and verification at least ONCE in TWO WEEKS period. 4. The e-log book must be submitted to the Supervisor and/or Co-supervisor (if any) with the BDP I Report or BDP II final draft for the purpose of evaluation and grading. 5. If the submission with respect to the BDP E-LOG BOOK/ BDP I REPORT/ BDP II FINAL DRAFT is not accordingly adhered to, the students concerned will be considered as FAILED. On the other hand, if the submission with the respect to the BOUND BDP REPORT is not accordingly adhered to, the result will be SUSPENDED until the student fulfils all the conditions set out by the Faculty and UTHM. 6.
